ERADICATING WILD PINE & DELIVERING WOOD!

To date, we have cut down approximately 700 wild pine trees in the isthmus of Māhia. We prioritize our Taiao, but recognize that this is only a fraction of the amount of wilding pine on our whenua, and we are looking into sourcing resources to continue this critical work in order to also provide a consistent supply of dry firewood for our whānau in need.



COMMUNITY MAARA KAI

After the crew created the Maara, we now have up to thirty large bins filled with various veggies. This was accomplished by growing lettuce in the ground next to a few additional fruit trees. The group is also conducting research to generate new concepts.
